### **Recipe of the Month - Pumpkin Crisp**

Servings: 8

#### Ingredients - Filling:

- 15 ounces pumpkin puree
- <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup sugar
- 5 ounces evaporated milk
- 3 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- 1/4 tsp salt

#### **Ingredients - Topping:**

- 1 cup crumbled gingersnap cookies
- 1 cup quick oats
- 1/3 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 tsp baking soda
- 1/4 tsp baking powder
- ½ cup butter softened

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
- 2. Grease a deep square pan or a 2-3 gt casserole dish.
- 3. In a large bowl, whisk together all of the filling ingredients; pour into the prepared dish.
- 4. In a medium bowl, combine the gingersnaps, oats, brown sugar, soda and powder.
- 5. Then, use a fork to incorporate the butter into the dry mixture.
- 6. Evenly sprinkle the topping over the pumpkin filling.
- 7. Bake for 35-45 minutes, or until the center of the pumpkin pie filling reaches 175°F.
- 8. The center will still have a little wiggle, but it won't be super runny.
- 9. Serve with ice cream or whipped topping, if desired.

## **Upcoming Chapter Volunteer Opportunities**

Members, even though the chapter pancake supper fundraiser has been canceled for this year, there are three (3) scheduled activities during the remainder of this year where you can earn work hour credits towards meeting our chapter member volunteer \*participation policy requirement. These are:

#### (1) \*Adopt-A-Road Cleanup at 9am on Saturday, October 15th (THIS COMING SATURDAY)

Our chapter is holding an Adopt-A-Road Trash Pickup for road-side ditches alongside stretches of Kings Fork Road and Providence Road. We will be meeting at the chapter park gazeb. Mike Lane, Board Member and Adopt-A-Road Chair, will be handing out safety vests, pickers, trash bags, and gloves, and providing a safety briefing and instructions on which specific sections of Kings Fork Road and Providence Road need to be patrolled for picking up trash. It is anticipated that the road cleanup will take about 2 hours, and after all bags of trash are returned to the park front gate area (stacked in front of the chapter sign), all members should meet back at the park gazebo to return the equipment to Mike, and to sign out. #### (2) \*Park Maintenance Workday at 8am on Saturday, October 22nd

Jimmy Fanny, Park Maintenance Chair has scheduled another park maintenance workday. The plan is to meet at the chapter park gazebo to be assigned tasks from the following list:

- FINISH TRIMMING DAM, ESPECIALLY ON THE BACKSIDE
- TRIM TREE BRANCHES THAT ARE EXTENDING IN THE PATH NEXT TO THE CHAIN LINK FENCE BEHIND THE SCHOOL
- TRIM GRASS/WEEDS ALONG SAME FENCELINE
- TRIM OVER HANGING BRANCHES/TREES ALONG THE EAST BORDER OF THE SHOOTING RANGE
- TRIM AROUND AND FERTILIZE THE SHRUBS PLANTED ALONG SAME BORDER
- TRIM SOME AREAS IN AND AROUND ARCHERY RANGE
- WEED EATING/TRIM GRASS FROM SHOOTING RANGE TO ARCHERY RANGE ALONG DITCH ON WEST SIDE OF RANGE

**NOTE:** If you have a scheduling conflict with this event but want to help with these park maintenance tasks, Jimmy encourages you to work on your own schedule out at the park on any day/time of your own choosing, but with a few cautions:

- Wear appropriate safety gear,
- · Work in pairs whenever operating power tools at the park,
- Be cognizant of our park's range schedules of operation and avoid working at the park's ranges while they are in use,
- Write legibly in the park sign-in log sheet in the gate mailbox and mark X in the work column so that you can be extended the courtesy of having your work hours tallied by the Membership committee without the need for you to submit a work hour credit form for those hours.

#### (3) \*Suffolk Recycle Tire Amnesty at 9am on Saturday, November 12th

Yes, this event includes receiving tires (without rims) and your help is needed to stack those heavy tires! Also, help is usually needed at the document shredding and battery recycling stations. Chapter board member Mike Lane volunteered to speak at the September chapter dinner meeting when the originally scheduled speaker could not attend.

Mike shared his experience with salvaging a very old long leaf pine tree located near Cypress Chapel in Suffolk. Based on the ring count, the tree was estimated to be about 315 years old.

Mike explained how the tree was cut down and milled into logs using a portable bandsaw mill. The tree produced approximately 1,000 board feet of lumber in total.
