Recipe of the Month - Turkey Corn Chowder

Ingredients

- 3 cups turkey, diced
- 2 large potatoes, peeled, diced into 1/2" chunks
- 3 celery stalks, sliced
- 2 carrots, peeled, sliced
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup butter
- 2 tsp garlic salt
- 1 tsp thyme
- 1 tsp pepper
- 1/3 cup all purpose flour
- (2) 15 oz can whole kernel corn, drained
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 2 cups heavy cream

Instructions

- 1. In a large dutch oven or sauce pan, melt butter and add celery, carrots and onions.
- 2. Cook until vegetables are soft, about 10 minutes.
- 3. Whisk flour, garlic salt, pepper and thyme together, add to pan, stir and cook for 2-3 minutes.
- 4. Slowly pour broth, heavy cream and diced potatoes into pan, stir.
- 5. Bring to a boil and cook for approximately 15 minutes.
- 6. Add turkey and corn. Stir and cook until heated thoroughly.
- 7. Remove from heat and enjoy.

The wildlife services provided by his organization include resolving human-wildlife conflicts and providing technical and direct assistance with an integrated approach to funding and damage management of Beaver, Canada Geese, Black Vultues, Feral swine, and Nutria. Recap of the October 22nd Park Maintenance Workday

We had a good showing of chapter Ikes on the morning of October 22nd at the park gazebo, and the weather was perfect. Everybody worked hard to accomplish the list of maintenance tasks previously identified by chapter Park Manager Jimmy Fanny.

Darden Langston reported that his work crew accomplished all of the tasks that needed to be done at the range. While Mike Lane's group concentrated on trimming in the dam's overflow area, other Ikes used chain saws to take care of dead trees near the pond's edge.

Jimmy said, "It's like a jungle in there", as he helped finish trimming the lower portion of the backside of the dam.
