## Recipe of the Month - Chicken and Broccoli (Chinese Takeout Style)

This stir fry recipe yields juicy chicken and crisp broccoli in a rich brown sauce. Yield: 4 servings



### Ingredients

• 1 lb boneless skinless chicken breast (or thigh)

#### For the Marinade:

- 1 tablespoon Shaoxing wine (or dry sherry)
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cornstarch

### For the Sauce:

- 3 tablespoons oyster sauce
- 2 tablespoons Shaoxing wine (or dry sherry)
- 1/2 tablespoon dark soy sauce
- 1/4 cup chicken stock
- 1 tablespoon sugar 1 tablespoon
- cornstarch1/4 teaspoon salt

#### For the Stir-fry:

- 1 head broccoli, chopped into bitesized florets
- 2 tablespoons peanut oil (or vegetable oil)
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 teaspoon ginger, minced

### Instructions

1. Slice the chicken against the grain into thin 1/4" bite-size pieces.

Transfer into a medium-size bowl. Add the marinade ingredients.

Stir to mix well. Let sit for 10 minutes while preparing other ingredients.

2. Combine all the sauce ingredients in a bowl. Stir to mix well.

Bring 1/3 cup of water to a boil in large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Add the broccoli and cover.

Steam until broccoli just turns tender and water evaporates, about 50 seconds. Transfer the broccoli to a plate.

3. Wipe the pan with a paper towel held in a pair of tongs. Add the oil and swirl to coat the bottom.

Spread the chicken in the skillet in a single layer.

Allow to cook without touching for 30 seconds, or until the bottom side is browned.

Flip to cook the other side for a few seconds.

Stir and cook until surface is lightly charred and inside is still pink.

4. Add the garlic and ginger. Stir a few times to release the flavor and fragrance. Return the broccoli to the pan.

5. Stir the sauce again to dissolve the cornstarch completely and pour it into the skillet.

Cook and stir until the sauce thickens, about 1 minute.

6.Transfer everything to a plate immediately. Serve hot with steamed rice or boiled noodles as a main dish.

The primary focus will be the Nansemond River in the Downtown Suffolk area. Participants opting for river cleanup need to bring their personal kayak or canoe. Cleanup supplies and registration will be on-site. For those cleaning from the river, longer grabbers can be provided.

If you choose land-based cleanup, you can work from the wharf or be guided to specific nearby sites that require attention. It's crucial to tackle litter before it reaches the river!


# Volunteers are needed for the Chapter BBQ \*Fundraiser Scheduled for Friday, April 11th
