## Recipe of the Month - Pork Tenderloin with Blueberry Sauce

A special thanks goes to our Chapter Cooking Crew for serving up a scrumptious pork loin dinner at our January chapter dinner meeting. A blueberry sauce was served following a tradition that first originated with our chapter's hosting of an IWLA Virginia Division dinner meeting back in October of 2019 when chapter VP Darden Langston prepared a crowd-pleasing blueberry reduction sauce to pair with the pork loin that he cooked for the occasion.

Recipe for Pork Tenderloin with Blueberry Sauce Source Credit: the gourmet gourmand.com.

#### Ingredients

- 1 lb pork tenderloin
- 1 heaping tablespoon fresh minced thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

#### For sauce:

- 6 oz fresh blueberries( about ¾ cup)
- 2 cloves garlic minced
- 3 tablespoons sugar (to taste)
- ½ cup balsamic vinegar

#### Instructions

- Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Prepare pork by removing fat and connective tissue. Pat dry with paper towel.
- On a large plate combine thyme, garlic powder, salt, and pepper. Roll tenderloin in the mixture until well coated.
- Place tenderloin on a large baking sheet covered in parchment.
   Bake in oven for approximately 40 minutes or until internal temperature reads 145 degrees.
- Remove from oven and tent with foil; rest for 10 minutes before slicing meat.

## To prepare sauce:

- Combine blueberries, garlic, and sugar in a large saucepan.
   Turn heat to medium. Mash blueberries with back of wooden spoon to let juices release. Simmer for 3-4 minutes, until blueberries are softened.
- Add balsamic vinegar and simmer for an additional 10-15 minutes, or until mixture is reduced and thickened.
- Serve sauce spooned over sliced pork medallions.

## Local Conservation Issues News - The Red-Cockaded Woodpecker Returns

"A red-cockaded woodpecker (RCW) spotted at Big Woods WMA (Wildlife Management Area) has been confirmed as a maturing fledging from 2022's clutch of two hatched eggs at Big Woods, marking an important milestone for DWR's efforts to recover the red-cockaded woodpecker.

The species has been listed as federally endangered since 1970 and is also state-endangered. Under the Endangered Species Act, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) created a National Recovery Plan for RCWs in the 1970s and DWR has a cooperative agreement with the USFWS to serve as the lead agency for the conservation of protected animal species in Virginia, including the red-cockaded woodpecker."

#### Local Conservation Issues News - Think You Found a Bear Den? Please Leave it Alone!

"While many of us also slow down for the winter, there are still ample opportunities that take us afield in bear country. Whether enjoying a hike, cutting firewood, clearing brush, hunting, or doing other activities you may inadvertently stumble upon a black bear den. A female black bear, particularly one who has had cubs, will likely remain at the den unless they feel pressured to leave.
