## Recipe of the Month - Beer Bread

Serves 6



#### Ingredients

- 3 cups flour (sifted)
- 3 teaspoons baking powder (omit if using Self-Rising Flour)
- 1 teaspoon salt (omit if using Self-Rising Flour)
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1(12 ounce) can beer
- 1/2 cup melted butter

#### Instructions

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.
Mix dry ingredients and beer.
Pour into a greased loaf pan.
Pour melted butter over mixture.
Bake 1 hour, remove from pan and cool for at least 15 minutes.

UPDATED NOTES: This recipe makes a very hearty bread with a crunchy, buttery crust. If you prefer a softer crust (like a traditional bread) mix the butter into the batter instead of pouring it over the top. Sifting flour for bread recipes is a must-do. Most people just scoop the 1 cup measure in the flour canister and level it off. That compacts the flour and will turn your bread into a "hard biscuit" as some have described. That's because they aren't sifting their flour! If you do not have a sifter, use a spoon to spoon the flour into the 1 cup measure. Try it once the "correct" way and you will see an amazing difference in the end product.

Chapter Board Member Mike Lane and Chapter Ike Ray Powell showed up to help sling tires at the SCCC (Suffolk Clean Community Commission) Recycle/Tire Amnesty event. Most of the tires were full of water from recent rainfall and soon our boots and clothes were soaked! Altogether, 1,065 tires were collected from Suffolk citizens and stacked for later recycling. Mike also helped sort through the metal collections bin and also helped with collecting batteries.

The guest speaker for the evening was David Rosenthal, City of Norfolk Reservoir Manager who spoke on the topic of "151 Year of Water Supply -- The Historical Development of a

Reliable System of Water Supply for the City of Norfolk". David reviewed the historical records going back to 1866 when the City of Norfolk was given a charter to form a water company. Today, he said, the total capacity of the Norfolk water supply, tapping into Suffolk and Virginia beach lakes, is approximately 15 billion gallons.



Chapter President Chris Ferguson announced that chapter Board Member Mike Lane was named "Volunteer of the Year" for the Great Dismal Swamp National Wildlife Refuge (GDNWR). Mike was presented the award at a GDNWR volunteer appreciation dinner held on April 2nd. Congratulations, Mike!



Also at this dinner meeting, the Tobin award for 2023 was presented by Chapter Treasurer Tim Doxey to Ray Powell. Ray has been a member of the chapter since 1989.
