Recipe of the Month - Shrimp Etouffee

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup oil
- 1/2 cup flour
- 1&1/2 lbs shrimp peeled
- 1 onion finely chopped
- 1/2 cup green onions finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves minced
- 1/2 bell pepper chopped2 stalks celery chopped
- 5 parsley spriggs chopped
- 1 large tomato peeled and finely chopped
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/8 tsp red pepper
- 1/2 tsp black pepper2 drops tobasco
- 2 TBSP lemon juice

Instructions

Have all veggies chopped before you start. Mix the flour and oil and cook in a large saucepan

until light brown.
Add remaining ingredients.

Cover and cook on very low 30-40 minutes or until there is sufficient gravy and shrimp are done

Service over rice.


S-N IWLA Members-Only Youth Elizabeth River Learning Barge Wednesday, July 24th

Interested in a Summer Youth Activity? The S-N IWLA Youth Program is gauging interest in the Elizabeth River Learning Barge. A minimum number of 15 youth are needed to reserve this event. One parent/guardian is required to accompany their child. There is a limit of 20 children for the Learning Barge event and each must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

This prospective Learning Barge session would be for children and grandchildren of S-N IWLA members. Parents/Guardians are responsible for transportation/supervision of participants. NOTE: Those that would participate will be required to have their own transportation. Chapter Youth Committee members will also be present to facilitate the learning experience by sharing applicable IWLA objectives.



So, what is the Elizabeth River Learning Barge? The Elizabeth River Project's Learning Barge is a floating river laboratory and classroom. IWLA family members between the **ages of 4 to 18** will hop aboard the Barge to learn about everything from wetlands, wildlife restoration and sea -level rise to the iconic Chesapeake Bay blue crab. After spending time on the Learning barge, IWLA youth will know how to treat the river for life. **Attendance will be capped at 20 children with 2-4 chaperones recommended.**

Place: This activity will take place at the Grandy Village learning Center, 2971 Kimball Loop Terrace, Norfolk, Va. The Barge is Coast Guard certified and remains tied to a dock during the entire program.

Duration: Duration of the program is one hour.

Cost: Cost ranges between \$15-20 per child. A group rate can be negotiated. The parent's/guardian's (one person) admission is free. **Time:** The Barge is only open Monday thru Friday from 10 June to 27 July, 2024. Two time slots are set for each day, the first being 9:30 to

10:30 am, and the second being 10:00 to 11:00 am.

The program is entirely outside so the children will need to dress accordingly (hats, closed toe shoes, water bottle, etc).

IWLA National Convention

Message from Jodi Labs, IWLA National President

The convention will be held at the Hyatt Regency Chesapeake Bay Golf Resort, Spa and Marina on Maryland's Eastern Shore. The hotel offers something for every visitor, including incredible restaurants, pools and a beach, kayaking and water sports, walking trails and so much more.

The discounted room rate for League members is \$175 per night - **but that is only guaranteed until June 17.** After that, the hotel will charge much higher market rates for rooms and on some nights, rooms

may not even be available. The Eastern Shore is a very popular summer vacation destination and this hotel will fill up fast.

Reserve your room **online** or by calling the hotel directly at (410) 901-1234 and providing our group code (G-IZWL) to receive the League's rate. This room rate is available three days before and three days after the convention (between July 11 and 19, 2024), **provided rooms are available**.

If you plan to attend the 2024 national convention and want to stay at the convention site hotel, <u>reserve your room before June 17!</u>

The League has confirmed participation from a range of speakers, including senior staff from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and state departments of natural resources who direct large-scale restoration initiatives focused on the Great Lakes, upper Mississippi River and Chesapeake Bay. During the Conservation Lunch, the Manager of the Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge, which is close to the convention site, will share her perspective on managing refuges in a time of accelerating change. **Learn more about these and other speakers.**
